Miss. Kishwar Sani

Madam Kishwar Sani was an exemplary figure in nursing and student welfare, and her entire life was a testament to selfless service, commitment, and integrity. After completing her nursing education in Pakistan, she pursued further training in Kuwait, where she spent eight years enhancing her clinical and professional skills. Her time abroad deepened her expertise and strengthened her resolve to contribute meaningfully to her home country.

Upon returning to Pakistan, Madam Kishwar received her first appointment as Head Nurse at Naseer Teaching Hospital (NTH) on 2nd December 1997. Her sense of duty, discipline, and compassion quickly set her apart. On 11th November 2004, she was transferred to the Farkhanda Institute of Nursing (FIN) at Gandhara University, where she continued to serve with dedication.

Because of her strong moral character and empathetic nature, she was soon entrusted with the role of warden for the girls' hostel, a position she accepted wholeheartedly. Madam Kishwar's tenure as a warden was marked by unwavering commitment and maternal care. Although unmarried, she became a mother figure to countless young women who passed through the hostel doors. She lived on the hostel premises, dedicating herself entirely to the residents' safety, well-being, and personal growth. Her office door was always open. Whether it involved late-night health concerns, emotional struggles, or personal conflicts, she listened to every student with patience and responded with immediate care, wisdom, and compassion.

On 7th December 2013, following the passing of the previous senior warden, Madam Kishwar was promoted to Senior Warden of the girls' hostels. This role placed her in charge of all administrative and welfare responsibilities related to the hostel. She approached her new duties with tireless energy and meticulous attention, maintaining her daily engagement with the students and never distancing herself from their everyday challenges. She closely coordinated with the Provost, ensuring transparency and accountability in all matters related to hostel affairs.

In addition to her role in student welfare, Madam Kishwar also contributed to academics. She was appointed Instructor at FIN and Public Health on 8th October 2015, and later promoted to Senior Instructor on 1st January 2019, further solidifying her role as a mentor and educator.

Known affectionately as the "light of Gandhara University," Madam Kishwar symbolized the values of sincerity, selflessness, and service. Her leadership extended beyond rules and regulations; she fostered a warm and nurturing environment where students felt safe, valued, and empowered. She upheld discipline, yet with a heart full of empathy, earning the respect and love of students, faculty, and administrative staff alike.

Her life story is a powerful example of how one individual, through humility and dedication, can transform lives and leave an indelible mark on an institution. Madam Kishwar devoted every moment of her adult life to the welfare of students, doing so without ever seeking recognition or reward. Her legacy continues to inspire those who knew her and will live on in the hearts of the many lives she touched.

Madam Kishwar's journey was not just a career, it was a lifetime of service. Gandhara University will forever remember her as a guiding light, a pillar of strength, and a true embodiment of the spirit of nursing and guardianship.
